



Peaceful Valley Donkey Rescue Wild Burro Project Mojave National Preserve Capture Plan: Phase 1



When released by the National Park Service, PVDR will begin wild burro operations in the southern region of the preserve, primarily on Mr. Blair's cattle operation. It is our intention to enter into an agreement with Mr. Blair and allow him and his wranglers to trap the burros at his existing water tanks. We would have personnel in the region able to pick these burros up with just a few hours notice. It is important to stress that these water tanks are already fenced and no alterations would be necessary. Each tank enclosure already has trailer loading capabilities.

Future Project Considerations

Cima Road


There is a band of burros, (approximately 10-15) living near the Cima Road offramp of I-15. These will probably be easiest caught with mounted wranglers. We have no current plan to collect these burros at this time.

Clark Mountain

There is a tremendous amount of sign in and around Clark Mountain, as this is adjacent to a BLM Herd Management Area; there will need to be some coordination. This area will require a helicopter to bring the burros out of the mountain. We have no current plan to collect these burros at this time.

It should be noted that the Peaceful Valley Donkey Rescue has been contacted by many other agencies and institutions to assist with their wild burro populations. We are already committed to Fort Irwin from Mid-June to Mid-July and will be transporting 100 burros from the BLM's Axtell facility in Late July.
